

# ICD-10 Tip Sheet

ICD-10 arrives October 1, 2015. Be ready.



## Indicate diagnosis codes to the highest specificity.

- ICD-10 CM has 3-7 digits:
  - Digit 1 is **alpha**
  - Digit 2 is **numeric**
  - Digits 3-7 are either **alpha or numeric**

### Do

- Code for specific eye (when applicable)
- Continue to bill with location modifiers when required

### Don't

- Code for left and right eye, if it's both, use a bilateral code

Use This		Not That	
H52.11	for myopia, right eye	H52.1	for myopia
H52.12	for myopia, left eye		
H52.13	for myopia, bilateral		

- Review your current systems and work processes that use ICD-9 codes.
- Identify any potential changes to your work flow and business practices.



## Code

What can you do to prepare?

- Examine relevant ICD-10 codes now.
- You don't need to use all 68,000 codes; your practice will most likely use a very small subset of codes.
- As with ICD-9, an alphabetic index and electronic tools are available to help with code selection.
- Electronic health record (EHR) solutions with intelligent, auto-coding can generate the appropriate code.
- Examples of commonly used diagnosis codes\*:

## Dates

ICD-9 codes will be accepted with a Date of Service on and **before** September 30, 2015.

ICD-10 codes will be accepted with a Date of Service on and **after** October 1, 2015.
